Company Description

Based in Smithers, BC, the Bulkley Valley Research Centre (BVRC) is a non-profit organization with a mission to encourage collaboration in natural resource management initiatives. The BVRC and Eclipse Geomatics Ltd. (EGIS) have partnered on the Augmented Reality Sandbox exhibit – an interactive spatial visualization tool built by EGIS that delivers a wide range of watershed education opportunities. The Sandbox is now available for use or rental to interested educators and organizations.

Job Description

The Watershed Educator will work under the direction of the Information Specialist at EGIS to develop and deliver educational materials on a variety of topics including landscape formation, watershed management, and geography featuring the Augmented Reality Sandbox Watershed Exhibit. Primary duties of the Watershed Educator will include developing educational materials for a range of audiences, liaising with venues and event organizers, and assisting with education sessions.

Employment Period: Seasonal position of 16 weeks with a start date of May 6, 2019 (negotiable and contingent on funding)

Hourly Wage Rate: \$15.00/hr (35 hours per week)

Some evening and weekend work may be required. It is expected some travel will be involved as the student will be engaged in local events across Northwest BC.

Qualifications

- Preferred area of study includes education with a background in science or geography, or a combination of training and experience.
- Excellent communication skills in order to engage kids, youth, and the general public.
- Self-starter with ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Hold a valid Class 5 BC driver's license.
