The **Bulkley Valley Centre for Natural Resources Research and Management** has now been officially in existence for one year and the Board of Directors want to take this opportunity to update our members about the Centre's activities. First and foremost, we'd like to thank all of you who have shown your support for an active and healthy research community in the region by becoming members. We would also like to acknowledge the contribution of Canfor and MSRM, supporting members and active participants since our inception. As well we have a new supporting member: PIR.

Our website ([www.bvcentre.ca](http://www.bvcentre.ca)) is up and running. Along with background information about the BV Centre, you can find information about completed and ongoing Centre research projects, future natural resources seminars, and upcoming funding proposal deadlines. You can also find governance documents and minutes of meetings of both the Board of Directors and the Research Planning Committee on the website.

The BV Centre has been successful in obtaining funding for 4 projects to date and is proponent or partner on 10 additional proposals that are presently in the review process. We have submitted or are in the process of submitting proposals to the Forest Science Program of Forest Innovation Investment (FII), Ministry of Sustainable Resource Management, Mountain Pine Beetle Initiative, Northern Coastal Information and Research Program, National Science and Engineering Research Council, Sustainable Forest Management Network Centre of Excellence, Softwood Industry Community Economic Adjustment Initiative and Vancouver Foundation. Proposals cover a broad range of topics such as ecosystem responses to forest succession, wildlife dynamics in managed stands, alternative silvicultural strategies, forest diseases, and effects of oil and gas development on seabirds.

Completed and on-going BV Centre projects are:

- Strategic research framework for landscape ecology in west-central B.C. (completed)
- Growth prediction of canopy trees in complex structured mixed-species stands. (ongoing)
- Sustainable forest management on alluvial and colluvial fans. (ongoing)
- Modeling stand dynamics in the mixed woods of Quebec's southern boreal forest. (ongoing)

You'll note that one of the roles of the Research Planning Committee is to develop project proposals. However, we encourage BV Centre members to contact the Research Planning Committee or members of the Board to discuss ideas for research projects that you may wish to undertake through the Centre. Proposals must be consistent with our objectives –supporting sustainability of natural resources, ensuring scientific excellence, relating to regional or local issues and extending/demonstrating research results to the public. You may also want to consider the BV Centre as a partner on your project. The role of the Centre as partner can vary with each project and include project review, extension, and/or administration.

Our first AGM will be held on January 26, 2004. We are planning a primarily social event with the necessary AGM business kept to a minimum. The AGM will be your opportunity to elect new Board members so we encourage you to consider standing for election.
